Frank Rush, Jr., and the Rocking R Ranch

Frank Rush, Jr., is a man who literally grew up in the saddle and has stayed there. His father was superintendent of the Wichita National Forest Preserve for 17 years, which covered the start of the famed Wichita Wildlife Refuge. Under his guiding hand a buffalo herd was established and another "vanishing breed"—the Texas Longhorn—began making a come back.

Reared in this environment with a ranger, cattleman and naturalist for a father, it was easy for Frank Jr. to follow the lead. He, his wife Genelle, son Frankie and daughter Suzy, carry on in the family tradition at the Rocking R Ranch at Meers, Oklahoma. The ranch, with ample modern barns and stables covers some 3,600 acres. The ranch house itself is designed to take advantage of the natural beauty of the area. Picture windows in practically every room provide a view of the historic Wichita Mountains.
